Challenges

1	Mrs Fraser	<p>As some of you know, I am a true chocoholic! I've already had my fair share of Creme Eggs and need some chocolatey inspiration. Can you please write me a recipe for a chocolate treat? 7	Mrs Fitzpatrick	<p>Why not have a go at leaf and flower pounding! Pick some flowers or pretty leaves (providing you know they are safe to touch) and lay them out on a plain piece of paper. Just follow the instructions in the picture or follow the link.</p> <p>https://abcdoes.com/home-learning/</p>  <p>Wax Resist Eggs</p> <p>What you need:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Eggs - wax crayons - food colouring - small pots - pan - wafer <p>What to do:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Hard boil your eggs - once cooled, draw on their shell with wax crayons - Mix a few drops of food colouring with wafer (enough to cover the egg) - Put the egg in food colouring and wafer for 10 - 20 mins - Take out and allow to dry - Admire your egg, then eat it!

Place a message or image at each hidden location indicating an activity, so that as the eggs are discovered, the hunters have an activity challenge to complete before they continue on their hunt, for example:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Throw and catch your egg ten times • Throw an egg carefully between partners • Pass your egg from hand to hand around your body • Pass the egg around your group while hopping on one leg • Do bunny hops <p>Can you draw a map for the hidden locations and draw or write the activities for your family to complete?</p>
